

River East Notice

The Lower Connecticut River Valley Council of Governments (RiverCOG) in conjunction with the Towns of East Hampton and Portland are preparing a comprehensive planning study for the Route 66, from the Marlborough town line to the Arrigoni Bridge.

Two public information meetings will be held, Tuesday, June 12th, at the East Hampton Middle School Library, 19 Childs Rd, from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Thursday June 14th at the Portland Public Library, 20 Freestone Ave, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

The Route 66 study is a transportation and land use planning study. The focus of the study includes reviewing both existing and future needs and deficiencies for the corridor. This includes existing traffic conditions, safety in addition to potential changes in land use that will affect the Towns in the future.

These are the first public information meetings for the study. We encourage you to attend one of these meetings to interact with our study team and provide your perspectives on Route 66. The format of the meeting will be a brief presentation followed by a workshop session where the public will be able to interact directly with the study team members.
